

**RVUSD INDIAN PARENT COMMITTEE MEETING**

The District will receive \$83,678 during the 2024-25 school year from Title VI through the EASIE Grant. These funds are to be used to support educational programs for the Native American students in our district.

We would request consideration for Title VI to fund the following goals/actions during the 2024-25 school year. The proposed budget and activities mirror the 2023-24 Goals/Actions/Budget. RVUSD will have a change in leadership with a new superintendent in 2024-25 and believe that if the IPC and the district want to revise the program activities, it might best occur during 2024-25 school year.

Goals for consideration:

1. Increase knowledge of cultural identity and awareness
  - Native History, Native Art, White Bison classes at RVHS
  - Guest speakers (local and regional)/ paying for supplies for activities occurring during presentations
  - Planning and implementing a school/community event (Big Time)
  - Professional Development for new staff members- cultural awareness and sensitivity
  
2. Increase Native American language instruction programs
  - Native American language classes at RVHS (provide fiscal support for Wailaki language instruction (Wailaki 1, 2, 3, 4)
